A few years ago I found the cover of a Golden Book, The *Pokey Little Puppy* (my favorite childhood story) in which my mother had written that it was a 3rd birthday gift from "Malinda." Melinda is exactly 13 months older than I am, so she must have been close to 4 years old, and I was almost 3

the day we met.

I lived at 571 39th
Avenue and Melinda lived at 558 40th Avenue between
Anza and Geary in the
Richmond District of San
Francisco. Our backyards
were offset about 3 houses.
One day I was playing in my
backyard when I saw a little
girl on the roof of our garage.
I asked her to come down
and play with me but she
couldn't get down.

Melinda was the oldest of the four Howell children. When she was 4, her sister Mary would have been 2, and the twins,

Charlotte and Albert, would have been six months old. Given the family constellation at the Howells, it's quite understandable how Melinda escaped her backyard

unnoticed.

I. on the other hand, was not an "only" child but I might as well have been, since I my sister was 18 and had graduated from high school the month before I was born. My brother, 3 years younger than my sister, was 15 when I was born and he left for college in Utah the vear I met Melinda. Consequently I had developed an imaginary playmate named KB to keep me company. I went into the house and

asked my mother to "get the little girl down off the roof so I could play with her." My mother naturally assumed it was my imaginary friend. Born with tenacity (which is often seen as stubbornness) I persevered until my mother finally consented to come and look. To her amazement there was a real little girl on the roof. My mother helped her down and that's how my lifelong friend, Melinda Christine Howell, came into my life.
